Conceptual Poverty as a Cause of Political Polarization Stephen Nathanson, Northeastern University

Overview: The basic point of this paper is that political polarization results partly from crude conceptualizations of views and options. If capitalism and socialism are the only options, then policy options on the role of market vs. government will be seen as extreme, all or nothing choices. The charts below counter this by highlighting a spectrum of choices and views. Depolarizing may occur if more options are seen so that choices don't look as extreme, feelings may become less intense, and citizens divide into many preference groups rather than large hostile blocks.
