- 1. What is the Non-Identity Problem? Explain how Parfit motivates the problem through various cases.
- 2. Explain and evaluate the various theses that Parfit discusses, e.g., The Same Number Quality Claim, The Person Affecting View, The No Difference view.
- 3. Could it be defensible to insist that 'what is bad must be bad for someone' while agreeing that we should not choose Depletion? Is there a way to explain why A is worse outcome than B if A is not worse for anyone?
- 4. What do you make of the Happy Child case? What are the consequences of the position you take?
- 5. What can be said for or against the The Impersonal Average Principle, or the Impersonal Total Principle? How might we arrive at the Repugnant Conclusion?
- 6. Is there a connection between how we might address the problems of Ch 17 and those of Ch 16?
