Paul Grice "Meaning"

- 1. What is the distinction between natural and nonnatural meaning? Explain Grice's analysis of meaning_{NN}.
- 2. Are the counterexamples to Grice's analysis? If so, can it be repaired in ways that maintain the same basic idea?
- 3. How might Grice's account, or a Gricean-style account deal with cases of bald-faced lies where I know that you won't believe what I say?
- 4. What is the relation between A's meaining_{NN} that P by x on an occasion, and x's (timeless) meaning_{NN} that P? Does what others typically mean_{NN} by x put constraints on what I can mean_{NN} by it?

"Logic and Conversation"

- 1. What is an implicature? What are the distinctions between conversational and conventional implicature, and particularized and general conversational implicature?
- 2. Explain Grice's principle and maxims. How, on Grice's account do I implicate something, and how do you understand what I implicated?
- 3. How common are implicatures? Do I implicate something every time I say something? Are there cases that are not well explained by Grice's theory?
